From our Executive Conference Minister ~ Iris deLeón-Hartshorn

This week as I have worked on a sermon, *The Right People on the Bus*, I was reminded through biblical narratives of how God uses the "wrong" people on the bus. What I mean is that God uses the unexpected, the frail, the weak, the marginalized and many times, the unwilling. The concept of "the right people on the bus" comes from the well-known business book, <u>Good to Great</u> by Jim Collins. It is about the way the world works and how we decide who runs and grows our organizations in a secular world. But God sees differently, thank goodness, and calls out: the reluctant leader, Moses; Rahab, a woman of the night; a widow in Sidon; a slave girl in the story of Naaman; a tax collector; a pregnant teenager named Mary and the list goes on. When we look at our congregations, who is missing? What might we be missing in our formation as a Christian community without the voices of the frail, the weak and the marginalized? This sermon was something I had to wrestle with as I prepared and listened to God. I'm still listening ...
