#### **Mennonite Central Committee**

**12th Annual High School Essay Contest: MCC U.S. Washington Office** is inviting submissions for essays about Palestine and Israel, immigration or military spending. This year's grand prize is \$500. Three regional winners will be awarded \$100 each.

"The high school essay contest is a wonderful way for students to explore the relationship between faith and public policy," said Rachelle Lyndaker Schlabach, director of the Washington Office. "We hope that the contest will promote church-wide awareness of public policy issues by highlighting perspectives of Anabaptist youth."

All essays must be submitted **by Dec. 17**. The contest is open to youth of high school age who are Mennonite, Brethren in Christ or Anabaptist and to all youth who attend Mennonite high schools. Immediate family members of MCC staff or board members are not eligible for the contest.
