From our Executive Conference Minister ~ Iris de León-Hartshorn

As I begin to think about our **Annual Meeting** in Salem this June, I get excited about both the theme, *Discerning in Community*, and the opportunities for training that we will be providing in four hour segments. The four courses we will be offering are:

- **X** Pastoral Reviews Nancy Kauffmann, MC USA Denominational Minister, will share the review processes available through MC USA, including various pitfalls to avoid and how to have an overall healthy process. This is open to congregational leaders.
- **# Preaching 101** You have been asked to preach while the pastor is away ... What do you do? Leo Hartshorn, who has an M. Div. in Anabaptist Dialogical preaching, will be presenting some ideas for novice preachers on preparing sermons and sermon styles.
- **X** Team Ministry You have a wonderful ministry team, now what? This course will provide tools for how to build a team that is healthy and effective. Instructor: TBA
- **BAFA BAFA Inter-cultural Dynamics** Iris de León-Hartshorn and Bob Buxman will take you through a two hour simulation game on inter-cultural dynamics. A time of debriefing will follow, including a presentation of actual case studies which will be discussed in light of the simulation experience. Limited to 40 participants.

I am sharing about these courses now so congregations can plan ahead and ask leaders to attend in order to build the capacity of lay leadership. More information will be coming in April. The trainings will take place Saturday afternoon (June 25), tentatively 1:15-5:15 p.m. Various one hour seminars will also be available Friday and Saturday. *God's grace and peace to you.* ~ *Iris*


