Tornados have struck with unusual frequency and ferocity this past spring. From the MDS office in Lititz, PA, Executive Director Kevin King tracked the "dizzying array of storm reports that came in almost daily in April and May." By June 7, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administrative (NOAA) reported 525 fatalities nationwide, the highest death toll from tornados since the NOAA began gathering statistics in 1950, and well above the annual average of 80 tornado-related deaths.
