As many of you are now aware, Mennonite Church USA and PNMC have been in conversation regarding the calling of Iris de León-Hartshorn to an MC USA Cabinet-level position as director for transformative peacemaking. Iris will begin working part-time with MC USA effective May 15th and will be part-time for PNMC from that date until August 31st. As of September 1, Iris will be full-time with MC USA.

The Board has met to discuss the transition process and we are in communication and working closely with Nancy Kauffmann, our Denomination Minister. As we begin the search process for another Executive Conference Minister, Nancy has given her assurance that she will be available to the Board and the Search Committee as needed. We are in the process of establishing a Search Committee at this time.

The Board is deeply grateful that Iris is able to transition over the summer. We are equally grateful for MC USA's willingness to work with us in this transition. Iris will be present for the Annual Meeting in June at Western Mennonite Campus. In addition, at our last conference Board meeting, Iris provided the Board with a list of planned tasks to complete prior to the end of August. This transition has come earlier to PNMC than expected, but it is our privilege to have had Iris in the Executive Conference Minister role. She capably brought some order to the final stages of structural change that were envisioned back in 2006 and 2007.

Lastly, Iris and her husband, Leo, are intending to continue living in the Portland area. Their gifts and awareness of the broader Mennonite community (nationally and internationally) will continue to be a resource to us. As we offer Iris' gifts back to the denomination, you are invited to pray for Iris and her new role as well as for our conference as we enter this time of transition. Latin American women call MWC community to prayer

Strasbourg, France—The Movement of Anabaptist Women Theologians in Latin America (MTA) invites Mennonite World Conference (MWC) member churches to establish an annual day of prayer during the month of May, focusing particularly on Latin American women.

The MTA World Day of Prayer is an initiative of the women theologians who gathered in Paraguay during the 15th Assembly of Mennonite World Conference in 2009.

Each year women from a different country prepare a worship guide that includes a meeting format, worship and teaching resources and background material for intercession.

The liturgy for 2011 was developed by Mennonite women in Guatemala, and is available online in <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u> at <u>http://teologasanabautistas.blogspot.com</u>. The prayer focus for this year is on Guatemala, Argentina, Cuba and Haiti. The materials include background information on each country.

"We have action plans that we hope will allow us to get to the horizon we envision," says Rebeca González of Mexico. "Our goal is that we may see relationships between men and women of the world transformed into equity and justice to build the Kingdom of God."

A guiding Scripture for the MTA planning, González says, isJeremiah 29:12-13: "Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will hear you. You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all your heart."

Last year, women from Mexico prepared the 2010 materials, whose intercessions focused on Chile, Haiti, Colombia and Mexico. Ofelia García of Mexico remembers: "It was very moving to hear voices united to intercede to God for the men and women of our beloved Latin America, and of course for all those who are victims of extreme violence and marginalization."

Fabiana Ambesi of Argentina adds, "We gathered to pray for all women in Latin America, with emphasis on the issue of violence against women (mothers, grandmothers, daughters, granddaughters and sisters) who are victims of physical, mental and psychological violence. We also prayed for our girls, boys and adolescents who are suffering abuse at home or at school, so common these days. We try to put ourselves in their place even without knowing them, clasping our hands and joining our voices, knowing that the Lord is the only one who can bring relief to these difficult situations."
