A celebration is scheduled September 29 for the release of a new youth ministry resource. Formation in the congregation is the emphasis of a new book on youth ministry, edited by Andy Brubacher Kaethler, of AMBS, and Bob Yoder, of Goshen College. *Youth Ministry at a Crossroads: Tending to the Formation of Mennonite Youth* has been released by Herald Press and the Institute of Mennonite Studies. The authors have shaped the book around the three-fold call to *Being, Knowing and Doing*.

Mennonite Central Committee

Akron, PA— The first, annual Northeast Asia Regional Peacebuilding Institute (NARPI) Summer Training, designed to equip participants with peacemaking skills to use in their home communities, took place Aug. 16-28, in Seoul and Inje, Republic of Korea. The 50 participants, representing eight Asian countries, Canada and the U.S., were equipped with practical training in peacebuilding based on personal experience. NARPI director, Jae Young Lee, is also the peace program coordinator for the Korean Anabaptist Center. He realized the need for such training after he studied peacebuilding at Eastern Mennonite University. Plans are in the works for next year's training in Hiroshima, Japan.

Mennonite Disaster Service

Crews from the Lancaster County Unit of Mennonite Disaster Service (MDS) worked in Ephrata, PA, in early September after Hurricane Irene caused severe damage up and down the East Coast. Volunteers helped local residents pump out basements, remove sodden carpets, drywall and furniture from flooded homes. Volunteers will continue to connect with homeowners in need of help in hard-hit areas of Lancaster County.

Carlos Romero, MEA executive director, announced that Timothy Burkholder, director for Development and Church Relations, will retire September 30, 2011. "We have been so grateful for the gifts that Tim has brought to the agency," Romero said.
