### AMBS

The Mennonite seminary in Elkhart, IN, will continue to be known as AMBS, but the institution is changing its name from Associated Mennonite Biblical Seminary to <u>Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary</u>, effective Aug. 28. "*Associated* tells the story of a previous generation when two seminaries merged into one," says Sara Wenger Shenk, AMBS president. Although "*Anabaptist* refers to the radical Jesus movement of the sixteenth century, it has reappeared with a second life and *new* Anabaptists from many Christian denominations are rediscovering Jesus' call to radical discipleship with renewed joy and fervor. As a seminary, we are ready to collaborate with a widening circle of new and global



Anabaptists, as well as other kindred spirits from diverse denominations, cultures and ethnicities." AMBS will redesign the Master of Divinity program, and plans to offer both a community-focused residential program and a program accessible to students at a distance. New professors will join the faculty including Rachel Miller Jacobs, assistant professor of congregational information; Andy Brubacher Kaethler, assistant professor of faith formation and culture; and Jamie Pitts, assistant professor of Anabaptist studies.
