Thinking about the upcoming holidays? Your gift of water will help bring a life-giving resource to families and communities, improving health and saving lives. It's not enough just to have access to water. Families need drinking water that is clean and free from contaminants such as arsenic, which occurs naturally in wells in places like West Bengal, India. In the village of Bagar, MCC supported the installation of an arsenic filter on a well that provides water to 200 households, including the homes of neighbors (from left) Jhalu Bibi, Manjura Bibi and Chayna Bibi. Now, says Jhalu Bibi, "our children are safe." Around the world, MCC works to improve health through water and sanitation projects.
