When the PNMC delegate body approved changes to the organizational structure of PNMC in 2010, a central element of the new structure was something called "A Conference Communication Council." A celebration started with early morning prayers followed by a chapel service in which President Sara Wenger Shenk called the AMBS community to renew their commitment to following Jesus Christ, being immersed in the Bible and led by the Holy Spirit.

Christian Peacemaker Teams

Orbis Books recently released *The Gospel of Rutba: War, Peace and the Good Samaritan Story in Iraq.* The author is freelance journalist and author Greg Barrett who went to Rutba, in the western desert of Iraq in January of 2010 with Weldon Nisly, Shane Claiborne, Cliff Kindy, Peggy Gish and three other people. Weldon, Shane, and Cliff had been injured in Iraq in March 2003, when they were there with Christian Peacemaker Teams during the early days of the US invasion of Iraq. A doctor and his medical assistants in Rutba saved their lives yet refused to take any money for their medical services even though their country was being bombed by our country. Weldon, pastor at Seattle Mennonite Church, suffered fractures to his shoulder, sternum, ribs, and thumb in the accident. The January 2010 trip was a long-dreamed return to Rutba for Weldon, Shane, and Cliff to find their caregivers and thank them



for their care and generosity. *The Gospel of Rutba* is the story of their 2003 peacemaking effort in Iraq and accident and their 2010 return in **peace and gratitude to Rutba**.
