Anabaptist Biblical Mennonite Seminary

MennoMedia

With the dream of raising a generation of children who are inspired to shine God's light in the world, development of a new Bible story-based curriculum called <u>Shine: Living in God's Light</u>, is underway by MennoMedia and Brethren Press. Work began more than 18 months ago to prepare this successor to *Gather 'Round: Hearing and Sharing God's Good News*. For congregations using *Gather 'Round*, the 2014 transition to *Shine* will be seamless. "We're very excited about *Shine*'s emphasis on God's light shining through us," said Rose Stutzman, project director. *Shine*'s foundational Scriptures include **Isaiah 9:2** and **Matthew 5:14-16**. "Jesus told us, **You are the light of the world**,' " explained Rebecca Seiling, project developer. "*Shine*'s materials take this seriously and serves to inspire children and their families to be that light in the world." Designed for children ages three through grade eight, *Shine* will incorporate the latest understandings of the ways children learn. Sessions include an emphasis on teaching prayer and other spiritual practices, and will highlight peace themes. The flexible multiage resource serves congregations with a small number of children of different ages.

Mennonite Church USA

When 6,000 Mennonites gather in Phoenix, a lot is possible! In keeping with the theme, "Citizens of God's Kingdom: Healed in Hope/ *Ciudadanos del Reino de Dios: Sanados por la Esperanza,*" attendees will have opportunities to explore what it means to live out our primary allegiance to God. There will be opportunities to learn about some of the ways our country's definitions of citizenship operate, and how we can engage in conversations about immigration and peacebuilding. Options include a trip across the Arizona/Mexico border; joining a traveling choir of Mennonites singing at sites of suffering and hope throughout Phoenix; becoming part of a dancing Mennonite flash mob; and attending a variety of learning experiences centered on these topics. *For more information, visit unnu.MennoniteUSA.org/Convention.*

Volunteers are urgently needed to finish, grade, form and pour slabs for a new storage building at the MDS warehouse in **Columbus**, **MS**. The project includes: 60' x 100' x 6" concrete slab for main building, 10 - 2' wide x 3' deep footings for metal frame "I" beams, 16' x 100' x 6" concrete slab with "swale" or gutter along front of building to direct water, 16' x 40' x 6" concrete slab for wash bay.
