From Our Executive Conference Minister, Katherine Jameson Pitts

I shared last month that we hope to gather stories of God's work among us. At our PNMC Annual Meeting we asked a delegate from each congregation to share with us a place they are seeing God at work, a challenge they are facing, and a way they are working with that challenge. The variety of ways we see God was amazing and an encouragement for all of us. Our challenges were equally as varied and present us with some fairly daunting situations. Our congregations face their challenges with prayer, work, and patience. As congregations shared and in follow-up conversations among delegates, I felt strongly that we need the opportunity to pray for each other. Some of the challenges we face are difficult ones. Many times a number of practical solutions have been tried, but the challenge remains. In some challenges there doesn't seem to be a human way forward. And so as a church, both locally and regionally, we are called to prayer. Over the next year, let's lift up different congregations together, to pray that God will lead them through their difficulties and bless them with continued glimpses of God's presence. In the next few months I especially encourage you to pray for and with Iglesia Menonita Pentecostes, Woodburn, as they are faced with the challenge of an aging building that needs extensive reconstruction. They continue to work at raising funds and exploring options, but truly God's power is needed to lead them to the next step. I encourage you also to be praying with and for Anawim, that God might meet the on-going need for resources and support in ways we cannot even imagine at this point. Let us rejoice with one another, mourn with each other, and pray for one another in the Pacific Northwest.
