Sadly, Dr. Richard Twiss, (*left*), of Vancouver, WA, passed away on **Saturday, February 9, 2013** at age 58. Twiss was president of <u>Wiconi International</u>, an organization that works to promote community, strengthen culture and foster spiritual vitality among Native American or First Nations people. Wiconi means "life" in the Lakota/Sioux language; Twiss and his wife, Katherine, founded the organization in 1997. Dr. Twiss was scheduled to share his passion in Phoenix on July 1 at the opening adult worship service of Mennonite Church USA's biennial convention but passed away after suffering from a heart attack. Please remember the Twiss family in your prayers as they face this profound loss of husband and father.
