Buffalo Shout, Salmon Cry: Conversations on Creation, Land Justice, and Life Together, a new book by Herald Press, is launching in recognition of National Aboriginal Day, June 21, in Canada. The book includes 18 essays from throughout Canada and the U.S. Editor Steve Heinrichs assembled writers from both settler and Indigenous communities. Essays written by Indigenous writers are bookended with poetry, prayers or reflection from the settler perspective, and vice versa. As Indigenous Relations director for Mennonite Church Canada, Heinrichs helps churches grow in awareness of "settler realities" and find ways to walk in solidarity with host peoples. The book takes a hard look at the history of stolen lands, the assimilation of Indigenous peoples and the current ecological crisis, and the role of settler Christians in those stories. "The church, sadly, has been an accomplice in the colonization of this continent," says Herald Press managing editor Byron Rempel-Burkholder. Heinrichs hopes the book "will be a source of encouragement, cultivating greater respect and understanding for Indigenous peoples, especially amongst settler Christian communities" and that "settler Christians who pick the book up would be unsettled in a good way, and find friends for conversation who are also puzzling through these questions." The book will be discounted 30% through July 19.
