

Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary

AMBS offers an academic degree program known as MAPS (Master of Arts: Peace Studies) that deepens the understanding of and commitment to the biblical vision of peace and justice and its embodiment in the world. The program is grounded in the assumption that Christ calls us to become part of a new community whose mission is to participate in God's reconciling work throughout the world. The MAPS program prepares students for peace and justice ministries from congregational to worldwide settings.

Concentrations include:

- Conflict Transformation, in cooperation with <u>Goshen College</u>, Goshen, IN.
- International Development Administration, in cooperation with <u>Andrews University</u>, Berrien Springs, MI.
- Urban Community Development, in cooperation with <u>Seminary Consortium for Urban Pastoral Education</u>, Chicago, IL.

MAPS is a 60-credit-hour degree, combining interdisciplinary study of the Bible, theology, ethics and issues of nonviolence, anti-oppression, anti-racism, peacemaking and justice.
