

Registration for the PNMC 2013 Annual Meeting is a 2-step process. Follow this <u>link</u> for step one to provide your contact information. Follow this second <u>link</u> to submit payment. (The registration fee is \$100 for the two-day gathering and also covers two noon meals. The Warner Pacific Bed & Breakfast option is an additional \$50 per night. B & B reservations must be submitted prior to **June 1**.) As the gathering gets closer, updates will continue to be made to the <u>schedule</u> and <u>training/seminar</u> listings so be sure to check <u>www.pnmc.org</u> for the latest details. If you would like to request financial assistance, please register early.

Conference moderator, Jeryl Hollinger, asks that all churches submit the names and contact information of each congregation's delegates as soon as possible. (*Delegates also need to register.*) As part of the Annual Meeting, the PNMC Board invites all pastors and chaplains, retired and active, along with spouses, to gather for an evening meal to begin the weekend. This Pastor/Spouse dinner will take place on the Warner Pacific Campus in the Edgvedt Hall at 6:30 PM on **Thursday, June 20**. Please mark your registration form to indicate your attendance.
