## **IN OTHER NEWS**

Religious leaders and members from a number of Oregon's religious communities will gather **October 16** for a public banquet in support of **abolition of the Oregon death penalty**. The event, "*People of Faith Against the Death Penalty*" will be held at the United Methodist Church, SW 18<sup>th</sup> and Jefferson, in Portland. Sponsored by <u>Oregonians for Alternatives to Death Penalty</u> (OADP) and Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon (EMO), the event will begin at 5:30 p.m. with a reception preceding dinner. Several faith leaders, including Rachel Ringenberg Miller from Portland Mennonite Church, the Bishops of the Episcopal Church in Oregon and the ELCA Lutheran Oregon Synod, Catholic Archbishop of Portland, Executive Minister of the United Church of Christ, along with leaders of the American Baptist, Methodist, Unitarian, Disciples of Christ and other faith communities represented in Oregon.

"An interfaith gathering of this type in support of the abolition of the death penalty makes public an important moral position held in common by many religious movements and traditions in this country. In the six states that have repealed their death penalty in the past six years, people of faith have played leading roles in those efforts," stated Ron Steiner, of OADP.
