# **Albany Mennonite Church**



During a worship service In mid-January, prior to a benefit luncheon to support <u>Sister Care International</u>, AMC conducted a special commission ceremony for member <u>Carolyn Heggen</u>, as she continues her leadership in the ministry of <u>Mennonite Women USA</u>. Heggen and <u>Rhoda Keener</u> began leading the Sister Care seminar in 2010. Since then it has been <u>presented in all 21 conferences of Mennonite Church USA</u> and internationally in Nepal, Guatemala, Mexico, Colombia and Bolivia. Mennonite Women USA is exploring next steps that include continuing to share the seminar around the world. Albany Mennonite recognizes the ministry of Carolyn nationally and abroad as an extension of the

ministry of the local church body. During the commissioning, the congregation affirmed Carolyn's sense of call, recommitted themselves to supporting her, laid hands on her in prayer, and sang a song of worship in Spanish in celebration of the expanding ministry of Sister Care International. Rhoda Keener says, "Carolyn is an amazing teacher, but more than that, the love she carries for women worldwide is what makes her ministry with Sister Care what it is."

Did you know that MCC offers summer service opportunities? Keshia Kay Littlebear of Billings, MT, spent four summers as an MCC U.S. Summer Service volunteer. She spent 10 weeks of her summers serving at White River Cheyenne Mennonite Church in Bushy, MT helping with recreational activities and as youth ministry coordinator. Eventually she supervised the church's Summer Service program while honing leadership skills that she uses today as a board member of Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) Central States. The Summer Service program is a short-term MCC U.S. initiative that supports young people of color in their development of leadership skills through working with their local churches or communities. Since the program's 1982 inception, 1,387 people have participated.
