These communities are deeply immersed in their context, enter into relationship with their neighbors and share God's grace and love in many ways. They take many forms that sometimes look like traditional church, but other times are more like experiments in new forms of Christian community. Values-based Leadership Program

Registration is open for the 2014-2015 sessions. The program helps individuals in leadership roles gain a fresh perspective, one that views leadership and organizational processes through a uniquely Anabaptist lens. This perspective guides participants in following Jesus' servant leadership model while celebrating both community and diversity. The five day program is divided into two parts: **October 28-30, 2014**, and **February 24-26, 2015**. Leaving a time gap between part one and two allows participants to reflect on and begin implementing what they are learning bringing real life experience back to the second session. Tuition for the two-part program costs \$945 before August 31, 2014 (\$1045 after August 31). Scholarship money is also available for individuals demonstrating financial need.
