From the PNMC Office

Thanks to all who participated in last Saturday's Conference Communications Council. Approximately 65 pastors and representatives (with another nine tuning in from Idaho through Skype) assembled at Zion Mennonite Church where all were met with warm hospitality and a delicious meal. Attendees were initially asked to describe what would define a successful gathering. The consensus was to "Listen to each other's viewpoints -- hear each other's deep needs and understand how others feel called to follow Jesus." The group was challenged to speak carefully and listen well as we approached the tender topic of LGBTQ concerns. Survey results from other conferences and church leaders across MC USA revealed how divided the church has become. Those attending agreed, that though it could be considered our denomination's golden calf, we maintain a deep desire for unity. And, in spite of the fear and anxiety attached to the issue's complexities, the hope for a common understanding endures. In the afternoon, participants divided into smaller focus groups. People could choose to continue the LGBTQ discussion; address PNMC's financial challenges; dream of fresh ideas on how to extend the church's vision in the Northwest, or reflect on how the conference has related to Western Mennonite School in the past and explore ways to nurture the relationship in years to come. In the end, participants expressed appreciation for face-to-face dialogue; a unique opportunity when we come from areas of vast geographical divide, but agreed that there is still much work to do as we prayerfully discern God's call.



Mennonite Central Committee

January 12, 2015 marked the five-year anniversary of the massive earthquake that destroyed Port-au-Prince, Haiti. Mennonite Central Committee representative, Kurt Hildebrand, recently wrote this letter to his infant daughter, Akila, describing his hopes and disappointments during the past five years of Haiti's slow recovery.

Mennonite Church USA

Although it's still more than five months away, Mennonite Church USA's 2015 biennial convention is taking shape. Registration is now open for the June 30–July 5 event in Kansas City, MO. (Hotel registration opens March 3.) Convention planners are lining up special presenters and exhibitors in addition to a full slate of worship speakers. "My team and I are ready and excited for everyone to join us in Kansas City this summer," says Glen Alexander Guyton, chief operating officer and convention planning director for Mennonite Church USA. "We want everyone who attends KC2015 to be able to engage in worship and experience the healing power of Christ at some point during convention."





Alex Awad of Jerusalem, pastor of East Jerusalem Baptist Chruch and a professor at Bethlehem Bible College in Palestine, will speak throughout the week. "Alex Awad is an evangelical Christian deeply committed to Jesus and to the way of peace in the midst of intense suffering and injustice," says André Gingerich Stoner, director of interchurch relations and holistic witness for Mennonite Church USA. "He and Bethlehem Bible College are a sign of hope. We have much to learn from their witness." After KC2015, Awad will travel to Harrisburg, PA, to participate in Mennonite World Conference's Assembly Gathered. Awad's presence is made possible by support from Mennonite Central Committee U.S.



Drew Hart, of Philadelphia, will be available throughout the convention week, offering several seminars focused on liberation theology and strategies for addressing racism in local congregational settings. Hart is a Ph.D. candidate at Lutheran Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, and his research focuses on intersections between black theology and Anabaptism. He is a part-time pastor and a regular blogger for *The Christian Century*.



Alan and Debra Hirsch, currently of Los Angeles, will offer several presentations on church planting and building missional movements. The Hirsches are the founding directors of the Forge Mission Training Network. Alan also co-leads Future Travelers, a learning program to help churches become missional movements, and is co-founder and adjunct faculty for the M.A. in Missional Church Movements at Wheaton (Ill.) College. He has written *The Forgotten Ways: Reactivating the Missional Church*, among other books.
