## Drift Creek Camp

Women of all ages are invited to the <u>Oregon Mennonite Women's Retreat</u> at <u>DCC</u>, **April 10-12**, **2015**. This year's guest speaker, Jennifer L. Gingerich of Salem, OR, works as a Clinical Chaplain at Providence Portland Medical Center where she ministers in the Maternity and Neonatal Intensive Care Units. She is an active member at Salem Mennonite Church. Jennifer graduated from Goshen College in 2002 with a degree in Bible, religion and philosophy, and Associated Mennonite Biblical Seminary in 2012 with a Master of Divinity degree concentrating in Pastoral Care and Counseling. Guests will gather each morning for singing, prayer, reflection and sharing. A quiet space will be available for those who crave time alone. Women are also invited to explore the benefits of spiritual direction. *Spiritual direction is a means to enhance spiritual formation in the life of the believer. In the classic sense a spiritual director is one who, as a representative of the church, walks with another as a mentor or guide to facilitate that person's relationship (formation) with God.*

Youth Ministry Council (YMC) is an annual gathering of youth workers (sponsors/pastors/leaders/educators) from across the denomination that meets to discuss the latest in youth ministry. The 2015 theme, "*Connecting our Stories: Imagining our Future*," will address the complex topic of racism. The planning committee recognizes that this subject is

not necessarily comfortable, but as followers of Jesus, we acknowledge that the intersection of life and faith is sometimes messy. Messy stories are all around us. Each night the news reports on Ferguson. On Staten Island. On places in our communities and neighborhoods, where peace is dim and hope wanes. Hard questions are being asked, and there are no easy answers. But there are stories to share. **Transformation always begins with building relationships**. Building relationships begins with listening and sharing. Well known author and pastor, Eugene Peterson writes, "Stories are verbal acts of hospitality." Sharing our stories of life and call is an authentic way of building bridges, forging relationships, and creating community. Inspirational speaker, Felipe Hinojosa, is assistant professor of history at Texas A&M and the author of *Latino Mennonites: Civil Rights, Faith & Evangelical Culture* (John Hopkins University Press, 2014) will share his own stories and journey into the theme of talking about racism with today's youth. Felipe is a storyteller extraordinaire, and captivates through humor, truth telling, and challenge. Through his historian lens, he will share the often untold accounts within the Mennonite church during the civil rights era when black, brown, and white youth worked for change, and inspire with stories of current youth movements which he calls, "*politics of the possible*," where a new world is being imagined.



Ingrid Friesen Moser, the Wellness Coordinator for The Corinthian Plan, highlights her own experience with the coaching aspect of the <u>Wellness Incentive</u> in her recent Mennonite Church USA blog post. It is a short piece is meant to be an encouragement for everyone toward creative ways of good health and good relationships. It is also true that one of the underutilized aspects of the Corinthian Plan by its members is the **Wellness Incentive**. The Wellness Incentive provides a money incentive, yes (up to \$300 each per employee and spouse participant), but also coaching benefits. *We hope Corinthian Plan members reading this will be encouraged to take advantage of that benefit*.

## Mennonite Women USA



In January 2015, Carolyn Heggen and Rhoda Keener led a Sister Care seminar for 55 women in Curitiba, Brazil with some of the women traveling more than 1,500 miles to attend. Planning was coordinated by Gladys Siemens, Deusilene Milhomen, and Linda Shelly. Carolyn says: "Fortunately, the warmth of the women's welcome and response matched the summer heat they are now experiencing in Brazil. The animated worship music, dramatic presentations of Scripture and liturgical dances enriched the material we shared and energized our time together." One woman who attended the seminar wrote: "I learned that we don't need to pass through suffering alone." Another woman wrote: "I was needing a time of healing. I loved the idea of 'God with skin.' I've had people who were the presence of God in my life. I feel challenged now to be that for others." The Sister Care manual is now available in four languages: English, Spanish, Kek'chi' and Portuguese. Several
