

MennoMedia

Fewer than one hundred people have joined the Old Order Amish-and stayed-since 1950. Marlene C. Miller is one of them. Miller



is the author of a new Herald Press book entitled Called to Be Amish: My Journey from Head Majorette to the Old Order. She joined the Amish church as an adult and has been an

ardent member of the Old Order Amish for 46 years. She and her husband live on a farm in Ohio, surrounded by their nine children, more than 40 grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren. In this rare memoir, Miller recounts her unhappy and abusive childhood, how she throws herself into cheerleading and marching band, and then falls in love with a young Amish man, Johnny Miller, on a country iceskating pond. Against the wishes of both sets of parents, and with an unplanned pregnancy, the two get married and begin a family. Miller shares her unusual journey as she deals with bitterness and depression and then the warm embrace of her new Amish community. Through conversion, she finds God's love, dons an Amish dress and prayer covering for the first time, and is baptized. Miller writes about the strain of having 10 children as a young mother, running a hundred-acre farm, and facing accidents and tragedy. Miller toys with walking away. Turning Amish proves to be anything but plain and simple for this former majorette. The book is the second in a recently launched series from Herald Press, Plainspoken: Real-Life Stories of Amish and Mennonites.
