Salem Mennonite Church

SMC will host the Salvadoran Human Rights Association (ASDEHU) 2016 speaking tour on **Thursday, March 10 at 7pm**. Bethany Loberg, of SMC, currently works as an interpreter for the organization and will be at the event entitled "The New Generation of Salvadoran Human Rights Defenders—Standing up to Disappearance in the Midst of Violence". Speakers include human rights legal defender Marina Ortiz, Founder and Director of ASDEHU. Relatives of recently disappeared youth will share their stories in hopes of raising awareness El Salvador's history of extreme repression and threats. The country currently struggles with a complex situation of violence, rooted in long-time economic inequality, gangs and deportation. The numbers of disappearances among young people is on the rise; *over 2,000 in 2014*. ASDEHU works with relatives of disappeared youth, providing legal counsel and seeking full investigations and trials. The U.S. is complicit in the roots of the current violence and American solidarity in support of human rights defenders remains crucial.

This year, FOR-USA, an ecumenical organization, is co-hosting the event as part of its centennial celebrations. "Preserving the Peace" will take place **July 1-4, 2016**. Oregon FOR has allocated \$4,000 for scholarships and FOR-USA is matching that amount in partnership for the scholarship program for youth and young adult peace and justice activists

and scholars, ages 15-34. Speakers include Jamila Raqib, the executive director of the Albert Einstein Institute and a close colleague of Dr. Gene Sharp on nonviolent revolution, and Erica Chenoweth, a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and author of Why Civil Resistance Works: The Strategic Logic of Nonviolent Conflict. A special nonviolence training track will be open to youth and young adults, led by FOR Bayard Rustin Fellow Rev. Osagyefo Sekou.
