Mennonite Central Committee

MCC is requesting donations to support its response to recent earthquakes in Ecuador, where members of multiple Mennonite congregations are among 100,000 people affected by the disaster. A 7.8-magnitude earthquake struck the Pacific coast of northern Ecuador April 16, followed by another on April 20. At least 570 people have been killed and more than 7,000 injured. Multiple Iglesia Evangélica Menonita Ecuatoriana (IEME) congregations are located in Manabi Province, an area that was severely damaged. IEME, a member denomination of the Conservative Mennonite Conference, has about 1,500 members. With encouragement from Rosedale Mennonite Missions, MCC has sent disaster response coordinator David Shenk to assist in assessing needs/response. MCC has three service workers in Ecuador, working with Quito Mennonite Church as the church assists Colombian refugees there. This is a project of Iglesia Cristiana Anabautista Menonita de Ecuador, a newly formed Mennonite conference in Ecuador. The capital city of Quito was not impacted, and the workers and church members there are safe. Donations can be made <u>online</u> or send checks to MCC, PO Box 500, Akron, PA 17501. *Donations should be designated for the "Ecuador earthquake response."*

Mennonite Church USA

In 2014, following a workshop led by Shana Peachey Boshart on children's spirituality at a Mennonite Camping Association meeting, Rachel Gerber and Elsie Rempel lingered to chat with Boshart. Out of this conversation comes a new opportunity. <u>Deep Faith:</u> <u>Anabaptist Faith Formation for All Ages</u>, is a new conference to be held **October 6–8** at <u>AMBS</u>, Elkhart, IN. "We realized how much our ministries had in common and lamented how little contact we had with each other," says Rempel, who was then staff for faith formation for Mennonite Church Canada. (*Gerber serves as denominational minister of youth and young adults for Mennonite Church USA, and Boshart as conference minister for faith formation of Central Plains Mennonite Conference*.) "We decided to start meeting online periodically to change that and were soon sharing lots of resources with each other," Rempel continues. "Before long, the idea of a conference was birthed — one that would help other people who care about faith formation to connect and learn from each other." The planners envision the gathering to be a practical opportunity designed to empower Anabaptist pastors, teachers and lay leaders in the church to develop a robust understanding of life with Jesus and expand their imagination of faith formation for the 21st century.

Mennonite Women

Carolyn Heggen and Rhoda Keener shared the Sister Care seminar in Kisumu, Kenya March 31-April 2 and in Dodoma, Tanzania April 7-9. A total of 85 women leaders representing all of the dioceses of the Kenya and Tanzania Mennonite churches attended. Debbi DiGennero of Eastern Mennonite Missions assisted with hosting throughout. Two women from the Democratic Republic of Congo and two from Burkina Faso attended the Kenya seminar with Mennonite Mission Network worker Nancy Frey translating the seminar for them into French. The Sister Care manual was translated into French and Swahili for these seminars. One woman responded after the seminar saying, "I appreciate the teachings that have changed my life." Another wrote: "I've learned that I should not internalize or hold pain in my heart, but choose someone to talk to." (Carolyn Heggen is pictured here teaching in Kenya with Carren Okello translating.) About this experience sharing Sister Care in Africa, Carolyn says: "Because of travel distances, heat and the multiple languages needed, this was a difficult trip. But hearing the women's stories, learning about the many challenges they face in their homes, communities and churches and experiencing the warmth of their responses to us and the Sister Care seminar made it a trip we will hold dear in our hearts."
