From the PNMC Office

This week we pray for Zion Mennonite Church in Hubbard, OR. The 124-year old congregation strives to grow together as a Christ-centered community, extending their Anabaptist branch into the world, bearing the lasting fruit of discipleship, and planting the seeds of God's reign through hospitality, service, and reconciliation with God and others. The folks at Zion are eager to share their hospitality as they will host the 2016 PNMC Annual Meeting. We gather to hear the story of God at work in our world through the incarnation of Jesus Christ, and through the life of his body, the church. *Come prepared to listen and to tell the story!* Our schedule is slightly different this year. We will begin each day in worship with our speaker, Chuck Neufeld. Chuck served with MVS for 25 years. Together with his wife Bonnie, Chuck also served as co-pastor of Community Mennonite Church in Markham, IL for 19 years. For the past six, he served as Conference Minister for the Illinois Mennonite Conference. He's recently retired and moved to North Newton, KS. Through his songs, stories, and talks, Chuck communicates a deep commitment to community, peace, justice, and service. He believes that a dedicated response to Christ's call requires compassionate action and redemptive living, and that this results in radically altered lives and communities. One church leader said of Chuck, "(He) is one of the most missional leaders I know. He constantly scans the horizon for evidence of God at work, then joins God in that work. Furthermore, he's good at telling stories about what God is doing." *Come and hear Chuck tell the story!*

In addition to receiving reports from the Executive Conference Minister, Treasurer, and Moderator, and acting on the Gift Discernment Team ballot, delegates will be asked to give direction to the future of PNMC through collaborating on questions such as "How can we put the SEED fund money to good use? What should PNMC look like in 10 years? Where does theological education for congregational leaders best happen in PNMC? How could the Annual Meeting be re-imagined?"

Weekend workshops include opportunities to acquire new skills, make connections, and learn from other congregations' experiences. We will enjoy "Bluegrass & Blueberries" with a concert by the Jericho Road Bluegrass Band and fresh blueberry pie from Gingerich Farms. (Folks who are unable to attend the whole gathering are welcome to enjoy the Friday evening festivities!) Alternate activities are being planned for those who are not delegates as well as activities for children and youth. The assembly will end after a traditional Mexican meal on Saturday evening.

Attendees are invited to visit the <u>Pacific Northwest Mennonite Historical Society's</u> Heritage Center. In addition to guided tours, including the nearby MCC Barn, the Heritage Center will be open **Friday - Saturday**, **June 24-25**, **10** a.m. to **5** p.m. If you plan to visit and have a special request, volunteers can be available for assistance. For specific searches, connect the <u>Heritage Center</u> ahead of time.

Please take note that Whiskey Hill Road from Hubbard to the Meridian Road crossing will be closed May 31-January 31. Drivers will not be able to get to Zion by coming on Whiskey Hill Road from Hubbard.

Coming from the south: go through Woodburn and continue on Highway 214 toward Molalla and then turn left at the blinking light, which is Meridian Road. Coming from the north: go through Aurora from I-5 or come through Canby on 99E from I-205.
