Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary

Explore Anabaptist History and Theology: Online, 6 weeks, non-credit, \$200; *Dr. Jamie Pitts, Assistant Professor of Anabaptist Studies* September 14 to October 25, Early registration deadline: August 24

Learn about the birth and development of the Anabaptist movements in the sixteenth century, giving special attention to their theological, social and political contexts. In addition to surveying the history and theology of the first Anabaptists, the course looks at various interpretations of "Anabaptism" and its meaning today. Students will be challenged to draw connections between the sixteenth century and their own life and ministry. Studying this material will give us insight into the diversity of the early Anabaptist movements. Students will be challenged to offer an account of Anabaptism and its meaning for today that accounts for its historical diversity. We will end our time by examining some of the theological topics Anabaptists held most dearly: Jesus, the Holy Spirit, and discipleship.
