Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary

A new series introducing Anabaptist Young Adults in Mission has been released as part of the Anabaptist Witness blog. Read the first post of the bi-monthly series in which current and former young adult Mennonite volunteers in mission share their reflections on Anabaptist identity, the spiritual foundations of their work, and explore what it's like to engage a culture that is different than their own. Anabaptist Witness continues the legacy of Mission Focus, founded in 1972 by Oregon-native, Wilbert Shenk, and edited from 1997 to 2012 by Walter Sawatsky. Following Sawatsky's retirement, representatives of Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary, Mennonite Church Canada, and Mennonite Mission Network carried out a wide consultation process about the future of the journal. This process led to the naming of two co-editors, Jamie Pitts and Jamie Ross, and an inaugural editorial committee tasked with renewing the journal's commitment to fostering dialogue among Anabaptists and Mennonites from around the world on key issues facing the church in mission. Based on surveys of former and potential readers, the co-editors and editorial committee decided to publish the journal twice a year, in print and online, and that issues would be thematic. Initial themes include Anabaptist identities, theology of religions, and food. Information on upcoming themes can be viewed *here*.
