Andrew Reimer-Berg, son of Don and Jennifer Reimer-Berg of Salem Mennonite Church, has received a scholarship of \$750 to pursue a degree at Eastern Mennonite University. He is attending Eastern Mennonite University of Harrisonburg, Virginia. Andrew said "Christ teaches us to be honest, responsible, and selfless. Responsibility means to spend money wisely, such as avoiding wasteful spending. This way, our money goes further, and we teach ourselves not to always expect superfluous 'stuff'." Andrew is among 42 recipients of Everence college scholarships for the 2016-2016 academic year. Mennonite Church USA

Sixteen qualified administrators of the <u>Intercultural Development Inventory</u> (IDI) from across Mennonite Church USA gathered for the first time **August 9–11** in Kansas City, Missouri. According to **Iris de León-Hartshorn**, director of transformative peace-making for Mennonite Church USA, the IDI is an assessment tool that measures the intercultural competence of individuals, groups and organizations. Intercultural competence is the ability to engage effectively and appropriately with people of other cultures. An IDI-qualified administrator, de León-Hartshorn has been using the IDI with area conferences and Mennonite Church USA institutions since 2012. "The learnings of intercultural competency show that until people are able to see differences and commonalities among them, it is very hard for them to recognize power and privilege," she says. "Developing intercultural competency helps people move to a place where they can better see and understand racism within their context." Read more <u>here</u>.
