



Zion Mennonite Church

ZMC pastors Mathew Swora and Jana Gingerich, along with Kara Kropf and Karen Tro, recently attended the AMBS "Deep Faith" conference which focused on faith formation for all ages. Three keynote speakers — John Roberto, president of Lifelong Faith Associates; Rachel Miller Jacobs, assistant professor of congregational formation at AMBS; and Brian Quan, lead pastor of Toronto (Ontario) Chinese Mennonite Church — addressed the conference, which featured daily worship, various workshop choices and optional evening activities. Nearly 30 workshops addressed topics of: physical and emotional



dimensions of faith and learning, specific faith formation resources, age-group dynamics from children to grandparents, and various other aspects of worship and Christian education. Evening activities included a nature walk, conversation groups, a coffeehouse exploring contemporary song choices and a tour of the adjacent Mennonite Church USA offices.

Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary



Amy Marie Epp is a pastor from <u>Seattle Mennonite Church</u> and has worked in Worship, with children, youth and families for over 10 years. She, too, participated in <u>Deep Faith: Anabaptist faith formation for all ages</u>. Epp reflected that, "Because of the conference subtitle, I went with a pretty narrow expectation. It's one I was looking forward to, but narrow nonetheless. I hoped to engage the question of how to work at education and formation inter-generationally. Mennonite Church USA/Mennonite Mission Network



At the recent <u>Constituency Leaders Council meetings</u>, Mennonite Church USA executive director Ervin Stutzman announced that over the past three years a group of generous donors has made gifts toward the loan balance of the new Elkhart, IN, offices. The bank loan, taken out at the time the building was completed in

January 2012, is now paid off – years ahead of schedule. The *Joining together, Investing in hope* campaign, which raised money for the building, had three goals:

- ~Provide an energy-efficient, accessible and functional environment for Mennonite organizations for at least the next 50 years. *This goal was achieved in January 2012*.
- ~Closer collaboration among six Mennonite organizations, and reduced costs, through shared space, services and equipment close to the <u>Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary</u> campus. ~Lower the annual facilities costs of these organizations from \$270,000 to \$170,000 per year, including an annual capital improvements reserve of \$50,000, freeing at least \$100,000 per year
- to support program ministries. In addition to the \$6 million in original facility costs, the campaign raised \$3.2 million to support the ministries of Mennonite Mission Network, Mennonite Church USA Executive Board, Racial/Ethnic Ministries and the Global Mission Fellowship.
