From the PNMC Office

From Conference Minister, Katherine Jameson Pitts: This Christmas remember the children who flee . . . from war, from poverty, from drought, from hatred, from Herod. Consider donations to Mennonite Central Committee as part of your giving this season. Recently, at Portland Mennonite Church, the congregation was reminded that Mary's song, the Magnificat, is in the tradition of the blues. PMC member Gerry Leatherman re-arranged the traditional carol, Away in a Manger, in that same tradition. May your hearts be stirred by this powerful song and beautiful, though haunting images, of the world's refugees here.

This week we join together to pray for Lebanon Mennonite Church. LMC has a unique history. It began in 1957 when voluntary service people serving at Lebanon Community Hospital (LCH) and local constituents began meeting. Throughout the life of LMC it has had a strong connection with health care and the local community owned hospital. Pacific Coast Conference of the Mennonite Church provided leadership of the hospital. When the new hospital was opened in 1952, Mennonite Board of Missions was contracted to have oversight. By the 1970s Mennonite Health Services was hired to provide governance coverage for LCH with numerous members serving on volunteer governing board and today congregational members serve on the Samaritan Lebanon Community Hospital (SLCH) Board of Directors. LMC is a Christ-centered congregation of sisters and brothers united together in a faith journey seeking a life of service to each other and their community. We believe that God calls us to a life of servanthood modeled after the life and teachings of Jesus as depicted in the Bible. We also believe that the biblical story brings us hope and that Jesus' teachings are applicable in our culture.



Partner Congregation relationships – If your congregation would like to learn to know another congregation from a different cultural or geographic setting more deeply, Executive Conference Minister, Katherine Jameson Pitts, is happy to match congregational pairs. Such partnerships provide opportunities for sharing stories and praying for one another in meaningful and personal ways. Partnering congregations might also consider pulpit exchanges or perhaps a joint meeting of Leadership Teams, as well as the potential for a shared retreat or service project. *Contact Katherine to participate*.

Franconia Mennonite Conference

Stephen Kriss, PhD, will begin as the new Executive Minister for Franconia Mennonite Conference on January 1, 2017. This appointment comes after a six month search process following the resignation of current Executive Minister, Ertell Whigham. He has served within Franconia Mennonite Conference for over 10 years, his most current role being as Director of Leadership Cultivation and Congregational Resourcing. He brings academic leadership continuing as the Associate Director of Pastoral Studies for the Lancaster, Pennsylvania campus of Eastern Mennonite Seminary. Steve is a collaborative, energetic, and creative leader who has a deep love for God and the Church. He is able to listen to all points of view while staying grounded in Anabaptist theology and practice.

Mennonite Disaster Service

Mennonite Church USA

The Mennonite Church USA Executive Board has developed **updated guidelines** for proposed resolutions that serve as "Church Statements." These statements, which "receive broad support across the church and give direction for Christian faithfulness" often speak to a current issue and provide a vehicle for witness, study, discussion and awareness. *Changes include:*

- making the Executive Board's Resolutions Committee a standing committee of the board,
- providing greater online access to proposed resolutions and more opportunities for feedback,
- limiting the number of resolutions that can be adopted at any given Delegate Assembly,
- allowing proposed resolutions to be brought to an assembly for discussion only, and
- encouraging the development of resolutions at any point during a biennium, not just immediately before an assembly. The last change is perhaps the most important, Mennonite Church USA executive director Ervin Stutzman says. "The most significant advantage of these proposed changes is to remove the time crunch that tends to produce hurried last-minute submissions and revisions, undue pressure to fit it into a crowded delegate agenda and lack of time for genuine discernment," Stutzman says. "Further, the proposed process will likely garner greater participation in the churchwide discernment process, resulting in better preparation for a deciding vote by the delegates."
