From the PNMC Office

We extend our deepest sympathies to Eliza (Hochstetler) and Seth Gingerich of Zion Mennonite Church in Hubbard, OR. Eliza's brother, Caleb, and wife, Hannah, were involved in a <u>tragic accident</u> on January 19 that seriously injured Caleb and took Hannah's life. The couple had been serving with <u>Service Adventure</u> in Jackson, MS. As unit leaders, Hannah and Caleb lived with and mentored a group of four young adults. They provided a safe space for participants to process experiences, develop faith, and discover vocations. *Hannah was loved deeply by the unit.* Renee Neufeld, a member of Prince of Peace Mennonite Church, and former Anchorage SA leader, will move to Mississippi and provide leadership support for the group while they process the tragedy. *Please pray for Caleb, their families, the Jackson team, Renee Neufeld, and the Mission Network community in mourning this loss.*

Together, we pray for <u>Albany Mennonite Church</u>. Gary Jewell, of Spokane, WA, is currently serving as interim pastor. He shared the following prayer concerns and congregational updates:

- We are in the middle of the pastoral search process. Pray that the right qualified candidates will emerge and that the process will move forward in a timely way. Pray for the search committee as they process candidate profiles.
- After a careful survey, it was decided to end the <u>Service Adventure</u> program after over twenty years. It has been a rich ministry, but it was determined that it was time to put our focus in new directions. *Pray that God will guide the congregation in new missional ways*.
- AMC now hosts <u>Mid Valley Gleaners</u>, though not a church ministry, it is a partnership that is meeting a great need by providing healthy food and healthy social connection for lower income members of the Albany community.
- Nine members traveled to southern California to experience life on the border. Participants must now integrate what they saw/read/heard into everyday life. Jill Baker, local high school counselor, reflected on her students whose lives are affected by immigration. She said, "The wall is not merely a border town issue. It's an Albany, OR, issue. It's a human issue. It's a Jesus issue. We have been encouraged to approach peace-making with this framework: see the injustice, immerse within that people group, contend with that people group, and watch for (and celebrate) moments of restoration." It was good have Andrew Nord home for winter break from Woodstock, Asia's oldest international boarding school. Andrew will return to Mussoorie, India for the remaining semester of his junior year. Andrew's father, Chris, attended Woodstock while his family served with MCC in Bangladesh.

West Coast MCC

WC MCC Executive Director, Nate Yoder, hosted a gathering at Salem Mennonite Church for pastors and locals interested in Mennonite Central Committee. The organization's 2016 Annual Report and this message of gratitude were shared. For nearly a century, MCC has sustained its mission of being a worldwide ministry of Anabaptist churches, sharing God's love and compassion for all in the name of Christ by responding to basic human needs and working for peace and justice. Migration issues have been relevant since MCC's inception when assistance was provided to Mennonites fleeing from Russia and Ukraine. For decades MCC has focused on providing RELIEF through food and emergency supplies; DEVELOPMENT through long-term efforts to restore the environment and build financial independence for communities; and PEACE by investing in sustainable justice initiatives in areas where conflict exists. In addition to its international work, MCC has invested in restorative justice programs and building educational opportunities in the western United States. Borderland Immigration Tours are being organized by former PNMC pastor Jack Knox and his wife, Linda, in southern AZ. (A tour is scheduled for late April.) Young adults between the ages of 18 and 30 are encouraged to explore opportunities through GAP (Global Anabaptist Peacemakers) Institute in Reedley, CA, as well as SALT, SEED, SWAP, and Summer Service programs to discover life-changing experiences locally and around the globe.
