- Restorative Justice continues with good outcomes in local schools for decreasing violence and recidivism.
- Immigration and current political concerns have increased anxieties; staff is responding as quickly as possible.
- Alex Awad toured the west coast with presentations on Palestinian Israel updates, giving explanations, and requesting prayer for the Christians at work for peace.
- Pauline Aguilar will be retiring later this year after many years of service with quilts and empowering others to donate material resources to MCC and to relief sales.
- Global Anabaptist Peacebuilders Institute will be held in May 2017 at Fresno Pacific University for young adults.

Mennonite Central Committee

MCC is funding an emergency water project for 10,000 families in the Iraqi town of Qayyara after residents were liberated from ISIS in August 2016. For two years, the people of Qayyara suffered under the rule of the Islamic militant group, which stole houses and possessions, enforced a strict dress code, restricted access to the outside world and imprisoned, tortured or killed those who violated their laws or opposed their rule. However, gaining freedom from tyranny also had its costs. In the process of forcing ISIS from the city, Iraqi and foreign militaries bombed parts of the city's main water treatment plant that was used as storage for ISIS weapons. In addition, as ISIS was retreating, its fighters cut power lines in the area and lit oil wells on fire. Thousands of people were left without electricity or access to clean drinking water. Residents depended upon unfiltered river water for cooking and cleaning. MCC learned of the need and in January began a three-month project to make sure all 10,000 households in the area had access to water. In addition, MCC supplied purification equipment so very vulnerable people can get free water at a central public location. In March, the United Nations Development Program will begin rebuilding the destroyed water treatment plant. Kaitlin Heatwole, MCC Iraq program coordinator, helped facilitate the project in Qayyara, the latest in a long line of projects MCC has carried out to support people affected by ISIS. "So many lives have been turned upside down by the conflict in Iraq," said Heatwole.

Mennonite Church USA

Ervin Stutzman, MC USA Executive Director, recently expressed appreciation for PNMC's support. He indicated that over the past three years PNMC has contributed \$41,031.36. He recognized that geography can create barriers that can make isolated churches like ours feel cut off from the broader church, but notes that participation in things like the Constituency Leaders Council, coming up March 16-18, brings conferences together. Mennonite Church USA has faced significant challenges in recent years. Though our unity has been fractured, MC USA remains deeply committed to the Anabaptist principles articulated in Vision: Healing and Hope: "God calls us to the be followers of Jesus Christ, and, by the power of the Holy Spirit to grow as communities of grace, joy and peace, so that God's healing and hope flow through us into the world." The work of the church continues and MC USA remains dedicated to:

- Supporting church planters
- Training church leaders for greater cultural competency
- Initiating new policies and procedures to prevent sexual abuse and help victims of abuse find justice and healing
- Updating the churchwide guidelines for dealing with ministerial misconduct
- Planning for a "Future Church Summit" to be held in Orlando

Mennonite World Conference



Renewal 2027 is a 10-year series of events commemorating the 500th anniversary of the beginnings of the Anabaptist movement. A day-long public conference on the theme "Transformed by the Word: Reading the Bible in Anabaptist Perspectives" was launched **February 12** in Augsburg, Germany. The gathering, which occurred some 500 years after Luther's famous appeal to *sola scriptura* launched the Reformation, explored how Anabaptist-Mennonites

around the world have engaged Scripture in the past...and how Scripture continues to be relevant in our global community today. Anabaptist-Mennonite speakers from five continents and several ecumenical guests participated, with opportunities for all participants to join in worship, singing and discussion.
