Registration is open for the **16th annual Bridgefolk Conference**, "Pilgrimage toward Christian Unity: *Beginning with Baptism*," **July 27-30**, at Seattle University. Bridgefolk is a grassroots movement of sacramentally-minded Mennonites and peace-minded Roman Catholics who come together to celebrate each other's traditions, explore each other's practices, and honor each other's contribution to the mission of Christ's Church. Seattle Mennonite Church has the opportunity to extend hospitality as the conference comes to the West Coast for the first time this summer. Conference participants will visit Seattle Mennonite and hear Lead Pastor Megan Ramer describe the Mennonite experience of being the church in the Pacific Northwest. The

ecumenical journey will then proceed to St. James Cathedral. Other speakers will report on the Mennonite partnership with the SU School of Theology and Ministry and highlight discoveries from the recently-concluded Trilateral conversations on baptism that the Mennonite World Conference held with Lutherans and Roman Catholics. John Rempel will bring a draft of the Trilateral report and invite conference participants to help shape the final document. A hymn sing, led by Ken Nafziger, and a footwashing service & agape meal are well-loved features of every conference. Tony Brown will share spirituals and songs of resistance. The conference planning team includes Bridgefolk founders Marlene Kropf and Weldon Nisly, Stanley Kropf, Seattle Mennonite Church members Pat Shaver, Larry Scheffler, Dirk Giseburt and Marilyn Stahl, and Brenda Bellamy of St. James Cathedral. Mennonite World Conference

Over the past 30 years, Mennonite World Conference (MWC) has been in conversation around the possibility of a name change. In 2016 the Executive Committee tasked the Faith and Life Commission to lead a process to bring a recommendation to the General Council in 2018 and for decision in 2021. Regional representatives will pursue conversations and gather feedback. A formal request from leaders of the Brethren in Christ Church in the USA who experience a sense of exclusion motivated the current conversation. Learn more <u>here</u>.
