We extend our deepest sympathies to the Bonham Brenneman family of Mountain View Mennonite Church in Kalispell, MT, who have recently lost three family members. Cathy Bonham Brenneman, 59, passed away in April. She was a Mountain View elder and has been involved with the PNMC Peace Committee. Cathy's daughter, Erin Brenneman, died tragically in July, at the age of 26, after being struck by a vehicle in a hit-and-run accident while she was walking near the Bakery where she worked in Portland, OR. In late July, Cathy's father, Robert Bonham, passed away at the age of 91. We pray for the family, including former Albany Service Adventure leaders Rusty and Mary Lou Bonham of Portland, OR, and for the Mountain View congregation, as they grieve these tremendous losses.

#### Mennonite Disaster Service

Fueled by the summer heat and dry conditions, wildfires are continuing to burn hundreds of acres and forcing thousands to evacuate their homes across the western United States and Canada. In British Columbia more than 200 wildfires were burning earlier this week many of which were near Ashcroft, Princeton, and 100 Mile House. The wildfires in B.C. have forced some 14,000 people to evacuate the area. Throughout California more than 13 wildfires are burning with the largest ones in the Central Coast area. Wildfires are also burning in Nevada, Arizona, Montana, Oregon, Washington, and New Mexico. There are currently more than 60 throughout the U.S. Let us continue remembering and praying for those in harm's way as well as the firefighters and folks helping to contain them.
