From Levi Ebersole, Corvallis Mennonite Fellowship, Service Adventure participant:

Greetings from your Service Adventure CMF representative in Colorado Springs, CO! I figured I would give you an update and a look into my time here in the Springs so far. For those not familiar with Service Adventure, it is a program run through Mennonite Mission Network for young adults to give a year of service while also getting to see a new part of the country or world. My volunteer placement is at Greecio Housing, a non-profit housing organization that offers subsidized rent to disadvantaged people, including veterans, seniors, and those with

disabilities. My role at Greccio so far has been as a maintenance tech. I work with a team of four others and we help maintain the many Greccio properties across the city. My placement has been a really wonderful fit for me and I am very grateful. I am also grateful for the awesome people I am living with. We have gotten to do a lot of fun activities outside of our placements including traveling to Albuquerque to see the balloon fiesta and visit with the Service Adventure unit stationed there. As I am typing this I am sitting in the cozy lodge of Rocky Mountain Mennonite Camp at 9,500 ft on the back side of Pikes Peak which has served as an amazing weekend getaway many times already for our unit and Beth-El Mennonite Church. Overall, this fall has been an **incredible experience and a great learning opportunity** for me in many ways. I would like to thank you for your generosity and making this financially possible for me to experience. And also, thank you for your love and support through prayer. Hope all is well and I look forward to returning this summer and sharing more stories.



Mennonite Women USA

Carolyn Heggen, psychotherapist specializing in trauma healing and member of Albany Mennonite Church, and Rhoda Keener, Sister Care director for Mennonite Women USA, taught Sister Care seminars in October 2017 in Nagpur, India for the Theologically Trained Anabaptist Women of India, and in Kathmandu, for Nepali and expat women leaders. In preparation for this event, Elisabeth Kunjam, Indian co-host with Rechal Bagh, organized the translation of the Sister Care manual into five of the many languages spoken in India – Hindi, Nepali, Bangla, Telegu, and Tamil – and printing of 2,300 copies for women to use to teach Sister Care in their churches and communities. Heggen and Keener also spoke at Union Biblical Seminary in Pune, India on "How pastors can care for the **spiritual and psychological needs of women.**"
