
#### Goshen College

#### What can saints and mystics teach us about faith, ourselves, and life in community?

With untested ideals and a thirst for adventure, Christiana Peterson and her family moved to an intentional Christian farming community, Plow Creek, in the rural Midwest. It sounded like a simple and faithful way to follow Jesus, not to mention a great place to raise kids. In *Mystics and Misfits: Meeting God through St. Francis and Other Unlikely Saints,* Peterson shares her discovery that community life is never really simple. She needs resources beyond her own to weather the anxiety and exhaustion of trying to save a dying farm and a floundering congregation. Peterson turns to Christian mystics like Francis of Assisi, Simone Weil, and Dorothy Day to find sustenance for the everyday struggles and unique hardships of community life. With a contemplative's spirit and poet's eye, Peterson leads readers into an encounter with the God of the sometimes "wild" mystics and "weird misfits." Along the way, she helps readers discover new perspectives on simplicity, hospitality, contemplation, church, and death.
