2018 PNMC Annual Meeting Workshops

1. Churches yesterday, today and tomorrow – Mennonite Mission Network Marisa Smucker (*Church Relations Representative*)

The world is changing, and the way we do church is also shifting and changing. Some congregations are shrinking, some are growing, some are merging, and some have yet to be planted. Last year church relations representatives interviewed conference ministers and other church leaders in the areas of church planting and church revitalization. Since those interviews, conversations have continued, and planning is underway. In this workshop we will talk about legacy churches, church revitalization, and church planting. Come ready to share your own congregational experiences and learn about Mission Network's plan for resourcing and engaging church planters and missional leaders.

2. Leveraging sharing funds to walk with your community – Everence

3. Endowments and Investing – Everence

Learn about setting up an endowment fund to help your congregation extend its outreach while also promoting stewardship of resources. An endowment fund is set aside and permanently invested, with the earnings available for supporting your ministries.

4. Meet the Speaker / Executive Director – Mennonite Church USA Glen Guyton (*Executive Director*)

A time for informal conversation with Glen Guyon, Mennonite Church USA Executive Director. As Glen begins his term in this new role he is eager to hear from the voices of members of Mennonite Church USA about your dreams for the church as well as to share more of his vision and story.

5. Healthy Boundaries: What your congregation needs to know – PNMC Katherine Jameson (*Executive Conference Minister*)

Across MC USA, conferences are providing training to pastors in healthy boundaries to try to prevent pastoral misconduct, but it's not just pastors who need this important information. If you are in congregational leadership you have a role too. *Continued....*

We will explore PNMC and MC USA expectations for pastors and ways that congregational leaders can work with their pastors to meet these expectations. We all want our congregations to be safe places for everyone and healthy pastors and leaders working together are key.

6. "Pathways" -- The Journey Forward Study Guide

The *Pathways* study guide is a way for groups to participate in the Journey Forward renewal process. *Pathways* invites congregations and groups across MC USA to engage in studying Scripture, singing, praying, storytelling, exploring Anabaptist history and values, discussing how they see God working in their lives and discovering how they can live out broader church values in their particular contexts. In this workshop we will take a closer look at the materials and how they can be used, including participating in a sample lesson

7. Blessings Shared – Pacific Northwest Mennonite Historical Society Led by Gloria Nussbaum, (*PNMC Conference Historian*)
