CIHAN

The Council of Hispanic Anabaptist Churches of the Northwest have been offering an educational opportunity to its members called EBAFOM which is a Spanish acronym for Anabaptist Bible School of Ministerial Education. The program is a joint effort under the supervision of CIHAN and IBA or Instituto Biblico Anabautista, a division on Mennonite Education Agency. Participating students have reflected about how the course has enriched their understanding of the Bible, expanded gifts of leadership and provided a better understanding of the roots of the Mennonite Church. For years, Pastor Samual Moran has been leading this course in Portland and McMinnville on a voluntary basis. However, the CIHAN congregations are hoping to raise \$19,500 over the next two years to support the ministry as it grows in numbers and impact. Students pay for their own materials and take turns bringing meals to share in class. Donations can come from congregations and individuals. - -Hearing about the Phoenix Restorative Justice Center as they establish their foundation by working in school systems.
- -The addition to the board of a young adult as a student intern for two years. **Kristin Bachman** from the Hyde Park congregation in Boise represents a Mennonite attending a university in the PNMC area.
- -The need for people willing to go abroad for 1-3 years with openings in México, Bolivia, China, Haiti. The new openings for SALT for fall 2019 are posted NOW so tap your young people on the shoulder and encourage them to apply.
- -The need to promote international relationships by hosting an IVEP participant. Is your congregation called to consider this?
- -Thinking about young adult programs how to capture the imagination, recruit for SALT, and teach peacebuilding in our region.
- -Anticipation of the **centennial of MCC in 2020**. A faith-based nonprofit that has continued to reshape and connect and maintain its focus on relief, service, and development for almost 100 years for its constituency and its recipients! *That is amazing!*

Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary

Dennis Miller of Goshen, IN, was in his late 50s when he realized it was time for him to explore other vocational possibilities. "T've been in construction my entire working life," he said. "Working in the church is something I always thought about but at the same time didn't think was a realistic option for me." Miller took a leap of faith and enrolled in Journey: A Missional Leadership Development Program, a distance-friendly undergraduate-level non-degree program designed to serve as a starting place for Anabaptist pastoral and theological education for Christian leaders. The program pairs online instruction with an ongoing mentoring relationship in which participants discuss their learnings and reflect on their leadership skills. Participants complete introductory studies in Bible, missional leadership, Anabaptist history and theology, pastoral care, preaching and worship planning while also deepening their practice of spiritual disciplines. The Journey curriculum, which was also used for the seminary's former Pastoral Studies Distance Education program, was recently redesigned to be more flexible and accessible. It now consists of online classes that incorporate video lectures, assigned readings, brief written essays, and opportunities for participants to interact with each other and pastoral guides through discussion boards and videoconferences.

Journey participants meet with a local pastoral mentor every two weeks and gather for face-to-face Weekend Learning Events with other participants and mentors once or twice a year. Upon fulfilling the program requirements — which can take two and a half to three years — participants receive a certificate of completion. Forty-one people have completed the program since it began in 2003 and it is now available to anyone around the world!
