Friday Morning

Healthy Boundaries 201: Social Media and the Internet

New technologies present new challenges. As pastoral leaders, our ethical boundaries need to extend to the virtual world as well as the real world. How do you manage your online presence? Your use of email, social media, and even texting? After a brief refresher on the basics of healthy boundaries, we will explore how to maintain appropriate boundaries while being connected in our tech-driven world. This workshop is required for those who have active ministerial credentials in PNMC or who currently hold ministry positions in PNMC congregations. Friday Afternoon-- 3 options

Following Jesus: Being Missional Disciples, led by Marvin Lorenzana, Mennonite Mission Network

Effective disciple-making takes place through close relationships. The Missional Discipleship Initiative (**MDI**) strengthens congregations and their ministries through intentional, authentic, and relational disciple-making. This workshop will equip you on how to use *Missional Discipleship Groups* (MDGs) as a tool for providing a meaningful discipling experience. Relational disciple-making isn't for the impatient. Although **MDI's implementing process** lasts eight months, the work of disciple-making takes years. This seminar will be presented in Spanish, with simultaneous interpretation into English.

Witnessing to God's Peace: Peace Church 2019, led by Katherine Jameson Pitts and Colin Saxton, Everence

Being a peace church is core to who we are as Mennonites but what does it mean today? As we work on justice issues has our peace witness gotten sidetracked? How do we strengthen our understanding of what it means to be people of peace in our current cultural and political climate? Looking at the roots of our peace testimony, engaging the challenges we face today, and claiming the tools we need to be people of peace we will explore ways to practice and proclaim peace as the core of the gospel.

Experiencing Transformation: Responding to Trauma and Building Resilience, led by Sue Park Hur, MC USA

Many of those in our congregations and communities have experienced trauma of various kinds. Violence leads to trauma; unhealed trauma leads to recurring violence against self and others. But it doesn't have to be that way. Individuals and communities can learn skills for addressing trauma, healing relationships, and building resilience which improves the well-being of all. Based on STAR training originally developed for community leaders after the attacks of 9/11 in New York and Washington this will be an introduction to working with trauma and how it affects your community and congregation.

Saturday will provide a variety of opportunities for worship, sharing stories, building relationships, strengthening our shared ministry, exploring resources from MC USA agencies.
