#### West Coast MCC

Please note changes for the 2020 MCC Bike Ride: After some brainstorming following an unexpected need to change venues, the planning committee has decided to have the ride's home base be at the Mennonite Village in Albany, OR. (*Thanks to Maribeth Kennel for the suggestion!*) For those who are unfamiliar with the Village, it is a huge community composed of houses, assisted living units, a memory care facility and a very large green space with an adjacent pavilion. *Thank you, Mennonite Village, for your generosity!*While plans are still coming together, here's what planners DO know:

- Dates will remain the same: **August 9-14**; cost will be approximately \$400-\$450/person.
- The majority of lodging will be camping in the large green space.
- Breakfasts will be provided by the Village; lunches will be provided by Salem Mennonite. *Planners hope area churches will be willing to prepare dinners*.
- There are 3 men's and 3 women's showers about a 5 minute walk from the lawn.

In addition to planning new routes around the beautiful Albany area, planners must consider details such as safety, lodging, meals, showers, etc. Planners realize that this ride will not cater to everyone's preference, but hope to work with folks to find a way for many to participate in and enjoy the ride! The tentative plan is for registration to open on **November 1st.**
