Drift Creek Camp

Supporters of DCC gathered November 8-10 for the 2019 Annual Meeting. For most, it was the first visit since the road re-opened after major restoration work on North Creek, a close tributary to Drift Creek. River Steward and representative of the Native Fish Society, Conrad Gowell, summarized the project. He shared images taken at each step of the way during the 4-month endeavor. The structure is the biggest open-arch culvert created by the manufacturer, making the culvert at North Creek the largest in Oregon. The structure is approximately 25-feet tall, 50-feet wide and 130-feet long. The goal was to create an expanse large enough to accommodate safe fish passage, fallen trees and high water levels during winter storms. Rock was hauled in to restore the creek bed after nearly 60 years of "fire hosing" caused by pressurized water exiting the former too-small culvert. Fish experts have already spotted more fish traveling up North Creek than what has been seen in decades.
