From our Executive Conference Minister, Katherine Jameson Pitts

Due to growing concerns of COVID-19, our congregations may not be able to be physically near to each other in the ways we are accustomed in the weeks ahead. And so, we need to think about **how to be community when we cannot gather in the same ways.** We need to think of how to help everyone feel connected and how to love our neighbors when things feel shaky. Seattle Mennonite Church have already been working to do this. Last week they both met online, using Zoom, to hear scripture, to share concerns, and to pray together. Pastor Megan Ramer, of Seattle Mennonite Church, wrote to the congregation, "One of our considerations in making the tough call to cancel worship has been to think in terms of the collective and not just in terms of individuals - a thing that we in the church are hopefully especially equipped to do. The decision to cancel worship altogether removes the burden from individuals within our congregation to have to choose to exclude themselves from the embodied community that carries on without them, and instead spreads the burden, loss, and grief to all of us. Indeed, WE will all share the sorrow of missing the embodied community experience, instead of that sorrow being unduly borne by only our at-risk-ier members. . While we want the spread of this virus to end, and we want to do our part, we also don't want any of you to feel isolated. May we know the presence of God's Spirit with us, especially now. And may we keep (creatively!) claiming connection and care for one another in a time of anxiety, social distancing, not touching."

I encourage you all to be aware of the situation in your communities, pay attention to the directions of public health officials, and care for one another. Currently, different areas of our conference are being impacted in very different ways, so even if COVID-19 is not a current issue for you remember those at the epicenter of this crisis and pray for one another.
