Mennonite Disaster Service Oregon Unit

The Mennonite Disaster Service Oregon Unit's Annual Meeting will take place Saturday, March 28, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Lebanon Mennonite Church. All are welcome. Come learn about projects in Oregon, California, Saipan, and more, including a presentation from Kathy Howell about Children's Disaster Service. To help with lunch planning, RSVP to <u>Clyde Hockman</u> by March 21. <u>An update from John Colvin</u>: Flooding in Umatilla and surrounding counties was due to unseasonable snow melt and heavy rains. Pendleton, Hermiston, the Umatilla Tribes, and other communities were impacted. Wendy and John Colvin have been in contact with the State of Oregon Office of Emergency Management (OEM) representative, Karen Layng, and the Oregon Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (ORVOAD) president, Michelle Hamrick (American Red Cross). As of the weekend of Feb 8th, the first responders set up a Multi-Agency Response Center (MARC) to assist flood victims with basic necessities. Team Rubicon coordinated the cleanup efforts with other agencies and spontaneous unaffiliated volunteers. This went well.

Now the long-term recovery phase begins. The Office of Emergency Management has been concentrating on assessments for disaster declarations for Individual Assistance (IA) and soon will focus on Public Assistance (PA). This information will aide Governor Brown in soliciting assistance from FEMA. MDS Oregon Unit will be focusing on unmet needs, to be determined by case managers. Steve Wiest, John Colvin, Roger Sharp, and Jerry Grosh will be in contact with MDS to determine an appropriate response.

Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary

Are you a high school student interested in a summer ministry opportunity? Are there youth in your congregation who have gifts for leadership and/or ministry? **!Explore helps youth test ministry gifts**. Through AMBS's !Explore program, students in grades 10–12 can explore ministry and theology, grow in spiritual practices and listen for God's call through a summer congregational internship and a Group Experience. This year's **Group Experience** is scheduled for **June 30-July 16, 2020**. There will be lots of time for site visits for experiential learning, worship and prayer together, discussion and research about theological questions, practice of selected ministry skills, and many opportunities to participate in a service project. The **Congregational Experience** is still an important part of the program. For this portion of !Explore (most of which happens before the Group Experience), youth spend 100 hours working in their home church on things like worship planning, preaching, music leading, teaching Sunday School, and visitation. There is flexibility now to finish up their hours after the summer experience. Participants receive a \$1000 stipend which allows youth to earn income as they engage the world of theological ideas and foster a call to vocation in the church. Please prayerfully consider who you would encourage to look into applying for the program. The **application deadline is March 15**. Forms are available <u>here</u>.
