## **Emmaus Christian Fellowship**

Several members of the Emmaus group and their families are teachers and coaches in the Meridian school district. Schools are closed leaving many children in the district short on food and their families needing help. Folks from Emmaus Christian Fellowship have contributed funds to the Bridge the Gap and Purposity programs within the district to help families meet some of those needs.

## Mennonite Village



In mid-March Mennonite Village started receiving a few phone calls from individuals asking if we could use homemade masks. Initially we were happy for the donations but not sure how many would be needed or how many donations could be expected. In a matter of days it became clear that we would need many, many homemade masks for our staff in order to preserve our PPE for those working closely with residents. We put out requests to community groups and local Mennonite churches and have received hundreds of masks in response. Masks are delivered in bags of 10, 20, 60 and even 100! And now that we are providing masks for all residents in our care areas, the need is even greater. Each homemade mask represents love and best wishes for our residents and staff. We have made new friends as donors tell us about the people who connect them to Mennonite Village and we have strengthened ties with the friends who have walked with us for years and continue to help us now. ### Mountain View Mennonite Church

Pastor Jeryl Hollinger reflects on Easter Sunday, "I was so blessed by our morning worship and the many joyful faces and greetings we were able to share. While ZOOM is not quite like being together, there is a great feeling of togetherness that comes from gathering in that way."

#### Portland Mennonite Church

In Portland, Street Roots is a local paper that is sold by people who are low-income or homeless. They buy the papers for a quarter, sell them for a dollar, and keep the difference. A couple of years ago we were asked if we'd be willing to have Street Roots sold at PMC. A couple of weeks later a vendor started to sell papers in the entryway after the worship service on Sundays. At the start, I think he was a little wary about being in a church. But people were friendly, and more importantly, bought the papers. And I was very glad to have the perspective of Street Roots available for our congregation. When we went to two services, his wife, also a vendor, started to sell after the early service. Over time a friendliness has developed between them and many people in the congregation. When we had to stop meeting in-person and there were no papers to sell, people asked to help. Since then we've been able to cover their lost income with generous donations. I remember a community partner once saying that people are homeless not because they run out of money, but because they run out of relationships. I'm really glad that our relationship with our vendors continues even while we are apart.

#### **Drift Creek Camp**

It was difficult to let go of hosting the 2020 Women's Retreat. Planners were excited to welcome **Roberta Egli,** director of Messy Church USA, to be the speaker. There were meaningful plans already in the works that will have to wait until next year. However, some would-be participants have turned their registration payments into a donation to help bridge the financial gap caused by the COVID-19 cancellations.
