The ride is usually a week long and takes place on even-numbered years in the northwest and in the east on the odd-numbered years. This year was to be special as it would celebrate MCC's 100 years of relief and development work in places of need around the world. Rich and Libbie Lapp, from MVMC, weren't ready to give up on celebrating a century of service with a "century ride" (In bicycling terms a 100 mile ride in a single day is called a "century.") They have decided to ride an alternate, independent "A Century for a Century" ride as a fund-raiser for MCC on Saturday, August 15. The pair will ride the Trail of Coeur d' Alene's Kellogg to Plummer and back. Folks are welcome to join them in body (*separately*) or in spirit! Folks are invited to be supportive by either joining the 100-mile ride or create your own ride with independent fund-raising or donate to MCC by supporting their effort. *Of course, this all depends on open travel and any other COVID-19 restrictions. Idaho Mennonite World Relief Festival

The IMWRF Board wants to put all energy into planning next year's Idaho Mennonite World Relief Festival to be held **Saturday, April 17, 2021**. A celebration of MCC's 100th Anniversary will be included in the 2021 Festival.
