The congregation was planted in early 2020 with the intention of reaching the lost and being obedient to the Lord Jesus' command to preach the Gospel, to "go, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit" (Matthew 27:19). Jesús reflected, "This is a very great challenge, so we asked the sister churches of PNMC and CIHAN for their prayers. We started with three families, 16 people. We managed to gain two souls for the Lord. However, we started in the midst of the pandemic and were forced to suspend face-to-face meetings. Still, the Lord has done great things, thanks to social Media. Every week more than a hundred people join us on Facebook and a group of 24 people see the messages on WhatsApp. Something good has come out of this time in which we are living. The gospel is being announced and people are being reached, even in México where childhood friends and family have been won for Christ. We thank God because he is good. We ask that you continue to pray for us."
