Register here (through January 28) for the 2021 Conference Communications Council. The Zoom event will take place on Saturday, February 6, beginning at 8:30 in the morning. We are excited to welcome guest speaker, Safwat Marzouk, Associate Professor of Old Testament / Hebrew Bible at Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary. He will share thoughts on "Reading the story of Joseph in an Age of Migration". Marzouk reflects on his vocation as a professor, "I study, teach and write about the Bible with an emphasis on how the triune God forms a faith community in the world. I believe God is at work forming a community with a dual identity as sojourners and as recipients of the promise of the kingdom of God. This dual identity helps the faith community to be rooted in the world and formed by different ethics. In a world where migration is seen as a challenge, the church should see it as an opportunity not only to show hospitality but also to celebrate difference and claim a biblical perspective on what it means to be the church." Each congregation is encouraged to send at least two leaders. Additional interested leaders are welcome to attend.

Did you know that John David Thacker, formerly of PNMC's Prince of Peace Mennonite Church in Anchorage, AK, has relocated to West Virginia? In June 2020, in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic, John David loaded his Honda Fit with everything he owned and headed east. He moved into an apartment along the banks of the Kanawha River. He did not have a job waiting for him, but he was following God's call to do something new— to plant an Anabaptist peace church in a city with no Anabaptist presence. Although there are Mennonite and Church of the Brethren congregations in West Virginia, there are none in the state's two largest cities: the capital, Charleston, and Huntington, one hour to the west. Mountain View Mennonite Church, Exerpts from Jeryl Hollinger's year-end reflection

It seems that everyone is ready for 2020 to come to an end. Christmas letters from friends tell the woes of dealing with the coronavirus. Columnists bemoan a turbulent election season and the deep divisions in our society. Discussions recall the economic doubts and realities that have crippled or delayed the fulfillment of dreams. Racial injustice, once thought by many to be a thing of the past, showed its unresolved face in graphic videos. Let's just get this year over with and hope 2021 will give us a better future.

Turning a page on the calendar, however, while giving an illusion of newness, will not change the realities of the journey we are taking together. The rocky and uneven ground we are treading is not a path defined or limited by a year. This ground is a mysterious section of a trail that has no predictability to it. We do not know what is around the next bend or what we will see when we get to the rise up ahead. We may hope for a level meadow with blooming wild flowers and the sweet aroma of breakfast by the creek, but if we are so fortunate as to muster an "all-is-well" feeling we will still have to watch our feet where there are certain to be some rocks and holes. Such is life.

The challenge in 2021 will be to find the beauty and to **do our best to make it beautiful for others**. If we choose, our thoughts, tongues and actions can hold each other close and find ways to spread love and kindness. Salem Mennonite Church

Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary

AMBS is offering two new scholarships:

—The Multicultural Church Scholarship is for students who are currently serving in or preparing for ministry assignments in a multicultural context and/or who belong to historically underrepresented racial or ethnic groups within the Mennonite Church. Each year, this award will provide a limited number of 100-percent tuition grants to full-time students beginning a master's program, or a limited number of 75-percent tuition grants to part-time students beginning a master's program.

—The MDiv Connect Student Scholarship provides a limited number of 75-percent tuition grants to students beginning the Master of Divinity (MDiv) Connect program.

Recipients of either scholarship can reside anywhere in the U.S. or Canada and do not need to move to our campus in Indiana to pursue seminary studies. They may receive these scholarships for the stated length of their academic program by meeting certain conditions. Applicants must be from the U.S. or Canada and be a member in good standing of a congregation that is affiliated with Mennonite World Conference or a related Anabaptist group. The application deadline for these scholarships is March 1. Applicants must have been admitted to AMBS by that date to be considered for scholarships, so it's a good idea to start the application process as soon as possible. Creating these scholarships is one way in which we are working to increase accessibility to graduate-level Anabaptist theological and leadership education for students of diverse traditions, ethnicities and racial identities — wherever they may be located.
