Pacific Northwest Mennonite Conference Conference Communications Council Zoom Meeting Minutes February 6, 2021, 8:30 a.m. to noon

Gathering and Instructions: Katherine Jameson Pitts, Executive Conference Minister, opened the meeting with a welcome and instructions for the day.

Welcome and Prayer

Dianna Eshleman, Moderator, welcomed all to the Conference Communications Council. She reminded us that the problems of sickness & death, political & social unrest, and disorder in the lives of persons in our communities and church family can feel overwhelming but, we can take comfort in **Jeremiah 29:11** knowing that it is not a promise to immediately rescue us from hardship or suffering, but rather a promise that God has a plan for our lives and regardless of our current situation, He can work through it to prosper us and give us a hope. She led the group in prayer.

Scripture – Psalm 16 - Kiara Yoder, PNMC Board member, read the scripture **Hymn** – "Be Thou My Vision" A video clip of Portland Mennonite Church singing this hymn was shown.

Executive Conference Minister Report – Katherine Jameson Pitts

<u>Finances</u>: Our financials ended the year in the black. Congregational giving saw a small decline but was offset by lower travel expenses. We were able to use the interest income for operating expenses while continuing to grow our investment funds. PNMC continues to support and grow our witness by distributing several Healthy Congregational Grants to congregations. Most recently grants were given to enable a congregation to prepare a hospitality suite in their church building and to support a laundry service for the unhoused. We have additional funds available for these grants, so let Katherine know if you are interested.

<u>Antiracism Training</u>: The PNMC Board is beginning the process of working at antiracism in our organizational structure through the use of the Intercultural Development Inventory and *Widerstand* resources on Racial Justice.

<u>Pastoral Transitions</u>: We had several pastoral transitions this year. Menno Mennonite Church welcomed Emily Toews officially as a co-pastor for that congregation along with her husband Bryce Miller. We accepted the transfer of Emily's ordination credential from Mennonite Church Manitoba as well as Duncan Smith's and Charlene Epp's credentials from Mountain States Mennonite Conference. The Leadership Team has granted a License toward Ordination to Ron Hershey, pastor at Filer Mennonite Church, and a License for Specific Ministry for Church Planting to Jesus Fuentes.

<u>Congregational Resources</u>: Mennonite Church USA and its agencies and related institutions have prepared resources for congregations in so many areas this past year:

- Peacemaking office to address undoing racism, climate care, immigration justice, and now resisting militarism
- Faith Formation office to help us serve children and families and reinvent youth ministry
- MennoMedia to deepen our worship and introduce us to new hymns.
- Everence to help us manage our finances in ways that align with our faith. If your congregation is struggling due to a pandemic related drop in income, remember that Everence has Congregational Financial Assistance grants available and The Corinthian Plan has a program to assist with insurance premiums.

It has been a goal in Mennonite Church USA that no congregation should face this time alone and without resources. You to explore all that is there for your congregations on their website https://www.mennoniteusa.org/resource-portal/.

<u>PNMC Annual Conference</u>: The Annual PNMC Conference will be held on 8/21/21. A decision will be made later whether it will be in person or online.

Prayer Requests:

- International Bethel City Church as the Muange's relocated to the Detroit area in Michigan and the congregation here closes.
- Congregations who are concerned about their families with children and finding creative ways to care for and support them virtually.
- Pastors have worked hard at learning new skills in the past year and many of them are tired. The challenge of reopening lies ahead and while the thought brings joy, there will also be new work to be done. We will need to be responsive and agile in new ways yet again.
- Congregations in pastoral transitions, which is different and can be difficult in these times. Zion is preparing for a candidate weekend later this month, Hyde Park has just formed a search committee. Western, Vida Nueva, and Lebanon are in a time of interim discernment.

Presentation

Safwat Marzouk, Associate Professor of Old Testament/Hebrew Bible, Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary gave a presentation on "Reading the story of Joseph in an Age of Migration."

After Safwat's presentation, we were divided into breakout rooms to discuss the following: Bearing these insights from the Joseph Story, reflect on the following questions:

- 1. How does mutual giving and receiving challenge the paradigm that you have been operating by as you envisioned relationships between host and migrant communities?
- 2. In what ways can power relations be an obstacle towards integration and how can it function as a catalyst towards inclusion and justice?
- 3. How can these insights be lived out in your congregation and PNMC?

After the 30-minute breakouts, we gathered again and addressed comments/questions and thanked Safwat for his presentation. The slides he used in the presentation will be made available.

PR: Sense of loneliness and life beyond COVID; dismantling white supremacy.

PR: Open to the Holy Spirit to become "less" so we can become "more."

B: Camp closed down for the summer but received an estate gift to keep kids at camp through scholarships.

B: Are able to reach more people through Zoom services.

B: More people are able to join prayer services via Zoom.

PR: Leadership is exhausted. Continuing to work with immigration and parenting is difficult during this time.

B: Thursday and Sunday Facebook Live. Have had weddings and baptisms.

PR: For healthy congregations and to recover from COVID. Pray for Samuel's family and health.

B: New leadership team and being able to participate in person.

PR: Pastor is on sabbatical. Pray for him and the Leadership Team as they fill in during the sabbatical. Brent Kauffman will do Lent/Easter (7 weeks)
