The PNMC Annual Assembly & Delegate meeting will take place on Zoom, August 21, 2021 from 9 – 12 AM (Pacific Time).

We have reluctantly abandoned our hopes for a safe in-person annual assembly yet a second year. It seems wisest to avoid a large gathering yet in August 2021. However, with the rising rates of persons vaccinated against Covid 19, we are very optimistic about a "normal" PNMC annual assembly in 2022.

More information, reports and expectations will soon be available regarding this year's ZOOM gathering on **August 21**. Currently, we are asking two things:

The Center for Sustainable Climate Solutions (CSCS) is a collaborative initiative of Eastern Mennonite University, Goshen College and Mennonite Central Committee to lead Anabaptist efforts to respond to the challenges of climate change. Seattle Mennonite Church partnered with CSCS to kick off the **Climate Ride** in Seattle. Riders are planning to reach Washington DC in July. The 501(c),(3) organizes life-changing charitable biking, running and hiking events to raise awareness and support sustainability, active transportation and environmental causes. Each partner brings a long and distinguished history of working for sustainability within their respective contexts and missions. Climate Ride began its cross-country journey on Sunday, May 30. Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary

AMBS has appointed Deanna A. Risser, M.B.A., of Goshen, IN, as vice president for administration and chief financial officer, beginning Aug. 1, 2021. Risser, who currently serves as vice president for finance at Goshen College (GC), will succeed Ron Ringenberg, M.B.A., M.S., who will retire in August after 18 years of service.

"Deanna's references praised her for her character and integrity, attention to her own spiritual growth, deep commitment to church/nonprofit organizational leadership, strong financial management skills and collaborative work style," said David Boshart, Ph.D., AMBS president and chair of the search committee for the position. "We are excited about the gifts and experience that Deanna brings, and we're eager for her to join us in building on Ron's legacy and carrying out AMBS's mission."

Risser earned a Master of Business Administration from Indiana University South Bend and a Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration from Bluffton (Ohio) University. She is a graduate of Bethany Christian High School in Goshen. Between 2014 and 2018, she also took courses in Christian formation at AMBS.



Everence

Elyse Burton, of Tualatin, OR and Portland Mennonite Church, has received a scholarship of \$1,000 to pursue a degree at Goshen College. Nearly 200 students from across the country applied for scholarships – a benefit of being an Everence member – for the coming academic year. Recipients were chosen based on academics, leadership, community involvement and responses to an essay question. As part of the grant application, Elyse wrote an essay on how her faith influences her attitudes around money and faith. Elyse said "A faith driven force of mine revolves around spending wisely for the earth. I am passionate about reducing my overall waste by buying reusable products. I support small businesses which helps fund companies with mission statements I resonate with even though it may be pricier. Making small swaps like buying coffee locally instead of Starbucks or hanging your clothes to dry instead of using a machine are some ways I feel my

faith encourages me to help make the world a better place." Mennonite Men

This spring Anabaptist communities have been enthusiastically planting trees, with over 2,250 trees planted in April alone. Congregations, farmers, men's groups, and schools have partnered with Mennonite Men to plant trees as part of Mennonite Men's campaign, JoinTrees, with the goal of planting one million trees by the year 2030. Steve Thomas, Mennonite Men U.S. coordinator and certified arborist, has encouraged JoinTrees partners to be creative in their planting projects. The results have been intergenerational events at a variety of sites, including tree plantings at churches, farms, retreat centers, and more.

In addition to the various planting events, Mennonite Men's board of directors also approved \$8,247.00 for 5 grants to congregations, farms, and environmental education projects to assist them in tree planting projects they're undertaking this spring and fall. "We have three goals with this campaign to restore God's earth," said Steve Thomas. "Doing our part to care for God's creation, we aim to mitigate global warming, serve climate justice, and sustain biodiversity."

"We continue to receive inquiries about how to participate in our campaign," said Thomas. "People are seeking to join this campaign by offering land to plant, making contributions to fund tree planting, and helping to plant seedlings. We are excited by the strong, positive response across the church." To date, 9,151 trees have been planted through the JoinTrees campaign.
