West Coast MCC

Highlights from the September West Coast MCC Board Meeting include:

- The Restorative Justice program is expanding in Phoenix and California, with a focus on schools and universities. By doing more "train the trainers" events, the emphasis shifts to prevention of violence and criminal activity.
- Those working in the **Immigration Program** are busy with the legal part of the cases, but realized they were also offering emotional and spiritual care. A trauma chaplain will be added to the team to assist the clients and staff, and connect clients to congregations for additional support.
- Katherine Smith in Tucson works with refugees that have just crossed the border, education to nonprofits, connections to women in detention centers, and borderlands tours.
- MCC set three focus goals in 2020 for the next five years. 1) uprooted and vulnerable people 2) peacebuilding and justice 3) Creation care and climate change. The board discussed what it is currently doing and what hopes and dreams to expand in order to address these goals in the West Coast region.
