It is not too early to plan ahead for the next Mennontie Arts Weekend, February 3-5, 2023. The first Mennonite Arts Weekend (MAW) took place in 1992 with a goal to celebrate the contributions of Mennonite artists by supporting them in their efforts to "reclaim their identity/relationship with the church." The successful event became a biennial gathering, organized and supported by members of Cincinnati Mennonite Fellowship. Every other February since, artists and art enthusiasts have come together for a weekend of presentations, workshops, performances and worship. In doing so, MAW seeks to encourage creative expression in Mennonite communities, to provide exposure for artists working in different facets of the arts, to provide a setting for interaction and the exchange of ideas, and to bring together practicing Mennonite artists and others of all traditions interested in the arts.

The number of attendees at the Weekend ranges from 175-225 and is not limited to professional artists. You'll see young and old, families with children, working artists, creative hobbyists, and those who are simply arts enthusiasts. For each event, the MAW planning committee invites 10 to 15 artists to offer presentations, workshops and performances: writers, poets, musicians, choirs, painters, sculptors, fabric artists, photographers, and more. Some names of past-presenters include Chuck Neufeld, Jeff Gundy, Marilyn Houser-Hamm, Jean Janzen, Julia Kasdorf, Greg Luginbuhl, Ken Nafziger, Mary Oyer, Lucia Unrau, Roy Yoder and Robert Regier, just to name a few.

Oregon Eco-Excursion, June 11-19, 2022

Ready to get out with others? Come alone or get friends for a different vacation... an eco-excursion. Explore outdoor wild spaces in scenic Oregon. Learn about forests in ecosystems of God's creation. Help with newly planted trees along the Zena Forest.

During this 8 day excursion, participants will . . .

- •Hike in lush forests with towering trees and falls
- •Kayak on the Salmon River Estuary and see wildlife
- •Learn about sustainable ecosystems in a working forest
- •Work a day and a half with a Zena Forest tree project
- •Go on a whale watching trip along Oregon's coast
- •Stay in old growth forest at Drift Creek Camp
- •Enjoy a restful retreat with God, trees and the Earth



This venture will be an experience for men to be together in the wild and work with a tree project supported by Mennonite Men to convert a pasture to forestland. This project—part of our JoinTrees campaign to plant one million trees—will extend the Zena Forest, a model working forest managed by a Mennonite family in a region with extensive clear-cutting. Accommodations will be at Cascara House at Oregon 4H Center Saturday—Wednesday night then Drift Creek (Mennonite) Camp Thursday—Saturday night. The trip will be coordinated by Steve Thomas, US director for Mennonite Men, certified arborist, and graduate student in urban forestry at Oregon State University. Learn more here.
